Dear Students,

We would like to inform you that the speaking part of the English Proficiency Exam will include group discussion.

- All students take part in group discussion. The groups consist of 4 people.
- Group members are required to have a 10-minute discussion in total. Students will have 2 minutes to get prepared, and then speak for 10 minutes about the topic and questions in the task card.
- Interlocutors will give the instructions for the exam and share the task card on the screen in exam halls.
- In your group discussion, you should try to use functional language, such as asking for clarification, agreeing / disagreeing, confirmation, apologizing, asking for or giving advice, etc.
- You should support your ideas with good, relevant explanations and examples.
- You should use signposting language as can be seen below:
 - ❖ First,
 - ❖ Another point is that
 - ❖ The most important reason is ...
 - ❖ One of the main effects of X is
 - ❖ Above all, ...
 - ❖ Most importantly, ...
 - ❖ For instance, ...
 - ❖ In my opinion, ...
 - ❖ I totally agree with you.
- You should use the rhetorical patterns (cause & effect, comparison & contrast, definition, exemplification, arguing for & against, listing, etc.) that you have learned in class.
- You should not include anything out of context into your discussion.
- You should avoid repetition. In other words, you should not mention the same ideas, explanations or examples over and over again.
- You shouldn't dominate the whole discussion. Instead, you should try to discuss the topic with your group members in natural way.
- You don't have to answer all of the questions. However, we suggest you discuss most of the questions in the task card and add more on it if possible.
- Please note that each discussion will be recorded during the exam.

INSTRUCTIONS

- You are asked to talk to your group members about the questions given.
- You have 2 minutes to think. You can take notes on a piece of paper.
- Then, you will have a discussion for about 10 minutes with your group members.

TASK CARD 1: CITIES

- Is it advantageous to live in a big city? Why/Why not?
- What is your favourite city? What do you like most about it? Why?
- How are city people and country people different?
- What are the biggest problems with living in cities?
- What damage do cities do to the countryside?
- When does a town become a city?
- Which world city do you think would be the best to live in?
- How will cities in the future be different from those today?
- If you were city mayor, what changes would you make to your city?

TASK CARD 2: BODY LANGUAGE

- What is body language? Define it using your own words. Why is it important in communication?
- How do you use body language in your daily life?
- How does body language help you to communicate?
- Do you think body language is specific to a culture or is it universal? Give examples.
- Suppose that your friend was telling a lie to you. How would you understand it? Which behaviour would give him or her away?
- In which jobs is it important to use body language? Why?
- Can we say that people who can use body language very well are more successful? Why/Why not?
